For the first time, the team also piloted **Freed AI**, an AI-powered dictation tool designed to streamline documentation and give providers more time where it matters most, with their patients.

## Honduras Vision Trip

## Neonatal Program

Every year, an estimated **2.3 million newborns die** within their first month of life—many from *preventable causes* tied to gaps in skilled care and healthcare infrastructure. Through **World Pediatrics' Global Neonatal Program**, we're working to change that by equipping local providers with the training, tools, and support needed to deliver lifesaving care.

From training more than 500 traditional midwives across rural Guatemala to expanding access to respiratory care through innovative bubble CPAP and oxygen systems with *Vayu Global Health*, this work is creating lasting impact where it's needed most.

Most recently, **Harper Lorencki**, Program Director of Neonatal Capacity Building, and **Vafa Akhavan**, CEO, attended the International Maternal Newborn Health Conference in Kenya—continuing to build partnerships and advance conversations around sustainable neonatal care worldwide.
